EXCELLENCE AHEAD: THE STOOPS FAMILY FOUNDATION ADULT SERVICES BUILDING A PLACE FOR ADULTS WITH AUTISM

According to a 2021 report by the U.S. Department of Labor, when young adults with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) graduate from high school, many have a difficult time developing a post-secondary education, gaining paid employment, learning independent living skills, participating in community activities, and gaining access to services including healthcare.

To provide life-span programs and services to help individuals with autism successfully transition to adulthood, Els for Autism is constructing (1st quarter 2022), as part of The Els Center of Excellence campus build-out, The Stoops Family Foundation Adult Services Building. This on-campus space will provide transition-aged students and adults exiting the school system programs and services in the areas of:

Employment Services, Therapeutic Services, Day Training, Recreation & Social

ON THE CAMPUS at The Els Center of Excellence®

Located in Jupiter, FL, The Els Center of Excellence integrates unique architectural components to create an environment designed specifically for children, teens, and adults on the autism spectrum. The 26-acre campus is currently comprised of four buildings:

- The Els Center of Excellence Administrative Building auditorium and conference center
- **The Rupert Education Wing** Early Intervention Program, Therapeutic Services, and The Learning Center, a tuition-free, Palm Beach County charter school (ages 3-14)
- **The Shanken Education Wing** Adult Services Programs and The Learning Academy, a tuitionfree Palm Beach County charter school (ages 14-21)
- The O'Donnell Family Pavilion gathering center for art shows, events, and other meetings



THE STOOPS FAMILY FOUNDATION ADULT SERVICES BUILDING

A new 21,000 square foot construction project designed in partnership with Collins Development Company and the architect firm, Spina O'Rourke + Partners. The building has been specifically designed to meet the needs of adults with autism by incorporating unique architectural elements including:

- State-of-the-art technology; interactive whiteboards, video cameras for observation and video conferencing
- Acoustiblock liner installed within the walls throughout the building to reduce noise transmissions
- Use of LED lighting throughout the building to reduce behavioral responses
- Quiet nooks in hallways
- Overall floor plan designed to promote safety, accessibility, and independence
- Neutral color palette throughout to create a calming yet engaging atmosphere

Employment Training, Support, and Placement

Job assessment, job training/coaching, and job opportunities with corporate and organizational employment partners are provided in the community and on campus. Vocational training labs focus on retail, grocery, business and food services skills, including a café with a drive-through window and gift shop area.

Day Training Program

Tailored for individuals whose primary needs are socialization, recreation, prevocational skills, and community involvement. This program will build on each participant's individualized strengths supporting the development and practice of social skills, independent living skills, safety skills, and engagement so that they can achieve greater independence and live a meaningful and fulfilling life.

Self-Advocacy

The Foundation's staff works with individuals to create "individual life plans." Regular reviews with the individual and family are conducted to track progress toward set goals.

Recreational and Social Services

Activities in other areas of the campus include recreation services and therapeutic arts programs, along with other programs to promote social interaction and health goals.

Supported Living

Therapy rooms with a shared living/dining area serve as training areas for individuals with autism spectrum disorder to learn independent living skills.

Post-graduation

Delivery of vocational and independent living skills to support adults with autism in their transition to meaningful job opportunities.

Microbusiness

Sea of Possibilities, an Els for Autism microbusiness, empowers adults to create, market, and sell artwork items collected from the beach and ocean, and opens many opportunities for adults to learn transferable business skills and practice their customer service interactions, communication, money skills, and product creation.

Full-Service Café

The Adult Services building will be outfitted with a commercial kitchen, thanks to the design expertise of Cheney Brothers. The kitchen will be at the heart of a full-service café with drive-through service, along with indoor and outdoor seating. The café will provide program participants with opportunities to learn and practice the job skills needed to work in the foodservice industry and employment opportunities for adults on the autism spectrum.

In-Kind Support Opportunities: food service equipment & indoor / outdoor furniture

Two-Bedroom Suite

Staged as an apartment or hotel room, this space is dedicated to enhanced life skills and vocational training. The space includes two bedrooms, a bathroom, a living room, and a laundry room and will provide an opportunity to learn daily living skills for all clients, especially those with the goal of living on their own. Along with the three therapy rooms on the second floor, the space can also be utilized for mental health counseling and speech and language therapy.

Classrooms

Five classrooms on the first floor will provide space for our Adult Day Training Program which will include training in the areas of vocational skills, social skills, independent living skills, and safety skills. One classroom will serve as a workroom for the Adult Day Training microbusiness, Sea of Possibilities.

Reception

Beginning with a welcoming reception area, the Adult Services building will create a safe and dedicated space for adults on the campus once they graduate high school.

> In-Kind Support Opportunities: furnishings & technology equipment

Golf Pro Shop/Retail Storefront

A Golf Pro Shop Vocational Lab will provide opportunities to learn retail industry-specific skills and ways to demonstrate abilities that will add value to core business operations.





In-Kind Support Opportunities: store inventory & equipment furniture

Grocery & Business Storefront

Grocery & Business Vocational Labs will provide learning opportunities in industry-specific work skills in each field in addition to "soft skills" needed to obtain and maintain employment in each industry.

✓ a transition plan


work programs
